
## *John F. Kennedy, 35th President*



The correct name for Kennedy's Air Force One is "SAM two six thousand," not "SAM twenty six thousand."

At the time of his inauguration, Kennedy was only 43. This made him the youngest person elected to the position.

In 1961 Kennedy declared that the U.S. would put a man on the moon by 1970. American Neil Armstrong walked on the moon in 1969.



President Kennedy was responsible for the creation of the Peace Corps.

During his inaugural address Kennedy said, "Ask not what your country can do for you, but what you can do for your country".

JFK had two children, Carolyn and John Jr.

JFK's book, "Profiles in Courage," won the Pulitzer Prize in 1957.

Kennedy commanded the famous torpedo boat, PT-109, during World War II.

Because of their perceived "perfect" life in the White House, the Kennedy Administration was often referred to as "Camelot."

The Kennedy half dollar was minted in 1964 to commemorate President Kennedy. It is still minted today.
