

This scavenger hunt will educate and inspire visitors in identifying the diversity of Airmen and some achievements and contributions displayed at the NMUSAF.


Start in the Early Years Gallery at station 1, then follow the History journey to each station until you reach the end in building 4.









**Army Green to Air Force Blue**

After the US Air Force became a separate service in 1947, it created new blue uniforms. Even so, Air Force personnel during the Korean War continued wearing US Army uniforms from existing stocks, including the famed "pinks and greens" clothing and "crush cap" hats from World War II. In some cases, Airmen wore a combination of Army green and Air Force blue uniforms.

For the enlisted, yellow Army rank chevrons were replaced with silver Air Force stripes. Another notable change was the renaming of some enlisted ranks in 1952—the Army ranks of private and corporal became "Airman."

An interesting result of this uniform change was the nickname "brown-shoe Air Force." The old Army uniform had brown shoes, while the new Air Force blue uniform had black shoes. So, "brown-shoe Air Force" referred to the old US Army Air Forces or to a person who had served in the USAF.



**FIRST BLACK FEMALE FIGHTER PILOT**




The legend of America's first female fighter pilot, Capt. Kimbrell, is a story of courage, determination, and a trail-blazing path. She was the first Black female to become a fighter pilot in the U.S. Air Force. Her story is a testament to the power of perseverance and the pursuit of dreams.


**16. Marcelite J. Harris's USAF career was marked with many firsts for Air Force women. She also became the first female maintenance officer. During her career, she held a variety of notable positions, including personnel staff officer and White House social aide. On May 1, 1991, Harris made history when she became the first Black female general officer in the USAF. For the next four years she remained determined to overcome roadblocks, and in May 1995 Harris earned her second rank, becoming the first Black woman to earn the rank of major general in the US military. In the year of her retirement in 1997, she was the highest ranking Black woman in the US military and the Air Force's first female Director of Maintenance.**






