1. In August of 1917, who became the first African American military pilot and one of only a few black pilots in WWI?




2. Lt. Scottie Hathcock was a POW in WWII. What did he do after the war that helped the U.S. Air Force?

5. What significant change did General Carl Spaatz publicly announce for the Air Force in April 1948?




6. What was the result of the inactivation of the 332nd Fighter Group?

9. In April 1962, The Dirty Thirty were sent to fly as advisors in the South Vietnamese Air Force 43rd Air Transport Group. What did their missions include?




10. What was the job of the African American identified in this photo who completed his 100th mission during ROLLING THUNDER?

2nd Lt Gilreath, a member of the 6147th Tactical Control Group, is seen here wearing a new summer uniform during this time.




14. Colin Powell was the former Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff and U.S. Secretary of State. How many rules did he have publicized?



Lawrence, Jr. was a member of the third group of aerospace research pilots for the MOL program.




19. While working at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Dorothy B. John used her math skills on a variety of projects. What projects were they?
