Egg Carton Glider!

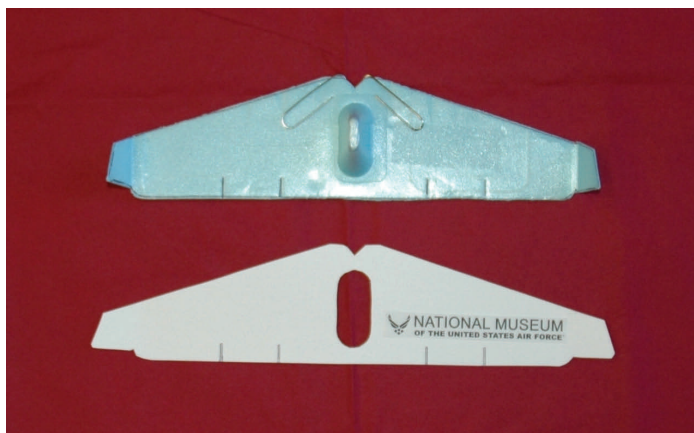


You will need the following items to make the glider:

- The top/lid from a normal dozen-size egg carton as shown (with a single protrusion in the center)
- A pair of adult scissors for you and/or student scissors for your students
- Two large (jumbo) paperclips
- An ink pen
- An X-Acto knife for adults who want to make more precision cuts
- The wing pattern/template located on the next page

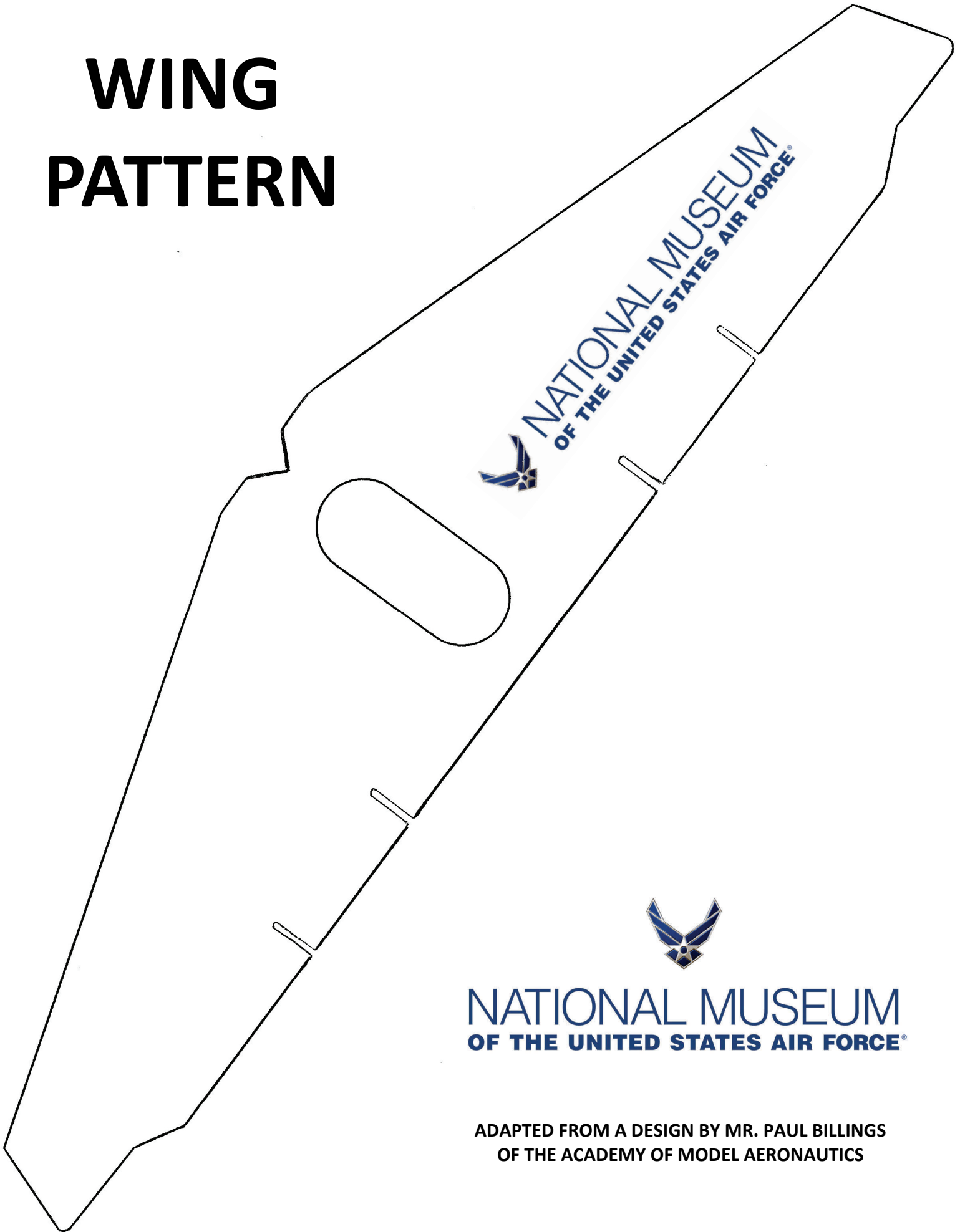


Cut out the wing template and place it inside the egg carton lid as pictured. Ensure that the winglets bend and go up on the sides of the carton. Trace the template with a pen, including the winglets, which should go to the top edge of the carton.



Carefully cut out the traced wing pattern, using either a pair of scissors or an X-Acto knife (for adults who want a more precise cut). Place a large paperclip on each side of the nose as pictured. Grasp the glider's central protrusion located beneath the wings, point the nose (paperclip side) away from you and give it a nice, gentle toss. You'll be surprised how well it flies!
