9) Medal of Honor - This is the highest award for heroism in military action that the U.S. can bestow on a member of its Armed Forces. The first Medal of Honor won by an Airman was awarded to Capt. Rickenbacker in 1918.

7) LUSAC - The LUSAC 11 was a combination fighter, light bomber and reconnaissance aircraft used during WWI.

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3) SPAD - Many American flyers used the SPAD VII early in the war and the improved SPAD XIII later in WWI.
4) Sopwith Camel - The British Sopwith Camel shot down more enemy aircraft than any other WWI fighter.
5) Rickenbacker - Capt. Eddie Rickenbacker became the leading U.S. ace of WWI with 26 confirmed victories.
6) Red Baron - The leading ace of all nations during WWI was Baron Manfred von Richthofen, the famous "Red Knight

2) Lusitania - Germany introduced unrestricted submarine warfare following the sinking of the Lusitania in 1915.

1) Germany - During WWI, the German Empire was one of the Central Powers that lost the war.
